President's Report:

Dania did not have one this evening.

Dania to get a copy of the last year's postcard to Penny for this year's Fall Show advertising. Invitational is on track but Sonya was absent for the meeting.

Laurie Kneppel will check into 2020 for other date for Fall Show/Sacramento Arts Festival date conflict.

SGAC Report:

Nothing to report. The bill from SGAC is a bit difficult to decipher.

Membership Report:

90 members (70 have paid, some unpaid people can be explained, and Dania will investigate)

Sharon will interview the current artist showing at Alpha Fired Arts, John Lennertz, and submit it for the next newsletter.

Treasurer's Report:

\$4862.54 (\$1089.00 spent on Seconds Sale ads and \$1500.00 spent on Fall Show ads last year) Scholarship will continue for Fall Show again this year. Student to turn in portfolio, essay and personal recommendations. The chosen student was given a booth space and \$100. It was discussed to increase the gift amount to \$250 by asking Alpha to sponsor some of it. Dania will approach Josh Tanner to ask about that. She will also approach IMCO to ask them about sponsorship.

VP Report:

Sonya was absent this evening but she is still leading the Invitational at Alpha.

Publicity Report:

Penny asked that anyone wanting pictures of work for the postcard to please get them to her ASAP. The postcard for the Fall Show will be done in time to be distributed at the Alpha Art By Fire Invitational on July 24^{th.}

Web Report:

Sandy was absent this evening.

New Business:

Someone who was a victim of the Paradise Fire is asking for replacement plates for ones that were destroyed in the fire. Ask Dania for information.

An upgrade to the website was discussed. Board members gave Dania suggestions on web designers. We will be exploring the cost of changing the website.

President's Report:

Dania welcomed everyone. With 7 board members present quorum was met and meeting began. (Sonva and Sandy joined meeting during Treasurer's report.) Dania asked if everyone had a chance to review the link and information she had emailed about the new website proposal and asked for feedback and questions. Everyone had positive feedback and no questions. Debbie made a motion to hire Ted Olson of Your Neighborhood Tech to design and host the website for SPG:Artbyfire. Budget not to exceed \$750 for design, and \$14.95 a month to host the new site. Sharon Bloom seconded the motion. Dania called for a vote: all were in favor with no one against. Motion passed 7-0. Dania will reach out to Ted to get a timeline and report back to the board. Penny asked to help out with the coordination and design and Debbie also offered to help so a website committee was formed: Dania Lukey Chair, Penny Leff, and Debbie Moore-Yip.

Dania asked if everyone received and reviewed the Board Job Descriptions document. Everyone did and had no edits or comments. The document will be made available to the membership either with next newsletter or in separate email. Dania asked if everyone reviewed the minutes for the last board meeting and if there were any edits. All replied no. Debbie made a motion to accept minutes and Marianne seconded it. Dania called for a vote and it was passed 7-0.

Treasurer's Report:

Debbie reports that we have \$4819.33.

Membership Report:

Sharon Bellomo reports no changes, we have about 70 members with about 20 outstanding needing to pay. Sharon will reach out to members. Sonya reminded us of there being a deadline for dues. Dania said because of the transition between her and Sharon when Sharon took over Membership Chair that late members were given some leeway on dues. Though, if members don't pay by end of July they will be dropped from emails and group list. Dania will work with Sharon to send out reminders. Penny asked for Board members to receive membership list so they can reach out to recruit for board positions. Sharon Bellomo will send out with the understanding that it isn't to be shared beyond board. Debbie asked if emails and phone numbers will be shared on the new website. All agreed that that should be an 'opt-in' as opposed to an 'opt-out' for members on the website membership page. The opt-in will be on the membership form, an email will be sent to current membership, and it will be mentioned in a newsletter. The information will be handled by the website committee. Sandy would like to also be in this committee and will be included. Dania made clear that nothing is happening immediately and the board will be made aware while the new design is developing. Dania will reiterate board's concerns about

privacy to Ted Olson and ask for particulars about how information is housed. She asks that the website committee start to generate questions and she will send email to them to set up a first meeting.

Webmaster Report:

Sandy asks for an updated membership list so she can include it on our current website. Dania says she will ask Ted Olson for timeline so Sandy doesn't do unneeded work. Dania related also that she asked Sandy to be our liaison to ACGA in regards to any shows in the future (2020 or beyond) the two groups combine to do. Dania says she'll put this on the next agenda.

Gerilyn reported she missed the last meeting due to illness. Sandy asks that she research weekends that are available at the SGAC to hold 2 day shows in the future. Gerilyn will research this and report at the next meeting.

Membership Invitational:

Sonya says there are 20 members participating with 50+ pieces. Riley from Alpha Fired Arts is creating a postcard for the show and Alpha will also host a reception. Sonya is working with Penny to publicize show as well. Sharon Bloom will create FB event once she gets images and information.

Newsletter Editor:

Marianne - No report.

Publicity Report:

Penny asked for feedback on the Fall Sale postcard she sent board. All said it looks good with Sharon Bellomo making small suggestion on wording. Penny will have 1000 postcards printed for our Fall Show. Debbie asks that Penny send her a note of publications we will use so she's ready to send payment. 

The Work of John Lennertz

Sharon Froelich Bellomo, Membership Chair

I recently had the pleasure of speaking with John Lennertz about his show at Alpha Fired Arts Gallery. His work is an homage to childhood memories of growing up in the "magic" of the Star Wars era. As he says in his Artist Statement, "I have sculpted clay for many years as it relates to the bronze casting process". "The work centers on the recontextualization of architectural forms and reliquaries to serve as metamorphic and narrative components throughout the work".

He creates by hand building with various clay bodies and various methods. He fires to cone 04 -1 without glazing. The surfaces are colored using acrylics, powdered pigments, watercolors and colored pencil, then are sealed with wax to produce a low sheen surface.



Many of his pieces incorporate the use of lenses. It gives the viewer an opportunity to peer into the piece and see another perspective of the title. The lenses are acquired from old overhead projectors and related technologies, which is available to him through work, since he teaches high school ceramics.

Unfortunately, the show closed over the weekend but keep your eyes open for his work. He is a local artist that I think you will be seeing more of in the future!

Participant can participate with "hands-on" or just watch and take notes. Open to all levels of experience.

We will explore my building techniques for both figurative and/or abstract shapes in clay. I'll show the participant how I construct and detail one of my whimsical figures. 

Glenn Takai 1947-2019

August 21 - September 21, 2019

Glenn Takai was a Japanese American ceramic artist born in 1947. In the late '60s, in a move to divert the destructive path he had fallen into during his teenage years, Takai reached out for some discipline that would support survival and change. "Art was a thing that I felt could hold my interest, and I needed a focus," Takai said. This proved to be a move that would lead to personal development and to a lifelong career in art.



Glenn's ceramic figures are both powerful in narrative and expression. Each sculpture captures an important moment and memory in life, painful and pleasant. After decades of self-exploration family became central to Takai's work, tracing the path of three generations of men: his great grandfather, his father, himself and his brother, and his two sons. Objects, landscapes, animals and faces serve to supplement his narratives.

Glenn has exhibited widely nationally as well as throughout the Sacramento region. His work is included in the permanent collections of the Oakland Museum and the Crocker Art Museum as well as many private collections.

California Studio Craft: featuring works from the Forrest L. Merrill collection

Studio craft combines the characteristics of traditional, handmade craft with the refined qualities of fine art. Made by professional artist-craftspeople who work in a variety of media, studio craft includes both utilitarian items and more experimental pieces that focus on aesthetics over function. For many, studio craft is an imaginative and personal expression that encourages creativity through the exploration of time-tested materials and techniques. The finest objects evoke emotion and exhibit the process of making along with evidence of the artist's hand.

During the mid-20th century, studio craft began to thrive in California. Working with materials including clay, fiber, wood, metal, and glass, studio craft makers pioneered new directions in their respective media. With the support of college programming, exhibitions, and a burgeoning consumer market, makers utilized an artistic focus that bound craft more closely to the fine arts. A revolutionary studio

craft movement emerged, and as the scene expanded around Southern California and the San Francisco Bay Area, other cities throughout the nation took notice.

California craft makers produced an array of modern, regionally unique items. Glen Lukens (1887–1967), who founded the ceramics department at the University of Southern California in 1933, was known for the "California Color" range of glazes that he formulated from minerals found in the state's desert regions. Laura Andreson (1902–1999), a Los Angeles-based potter who

experimented with crystalline glazes, assembled a ceramics program for the University of California, Los Angeles, a short time later. Some of the state's pioneering craft makers, such as the husband-and-wife team of Otto (1908–2007) and Gertrude (1908–1971) Natzler, immigrated from Europe and brought with them centuries of European methods for working with clay.

AMOCA - The American Museum of Ceramic Art Juan Quezada: The Legend of Mata Ortiz

June 8 - December 29, 2019



An encyclopedic retrospective of over seventy pieces, including rare early works. Enjoy this exclusive opportunity to meet Mexico-based artist Juan Quezada and hear from Colorado-based artist and collector Michael Wisner. Juan Quezada's work is inspired by the Paquimé (or Casas Grandes) pottery. Widely considered the founder of the Mata Ortiz movement, he is known for curvilinear designs with

tight, geometrical patterns – his unique reinterpretation of historical Paquimé iconography. In 1999, Quezada received the Premio Nacional de Ciencias y Artes – Mexico's highest award for a living artist.

Michael Wisner is inspired by ancient Anasazi and Mimbres potsherds, Wisner began making in the southwestern tradition nearly 30 years ago. In 1989 he began an apprenticeship with Juan Quezada, and continues to dig local clays from the ground near his studio in Woody Creek, Colorado to this day. His work is uniquely his own, but the influence of Quezada remains deeply within his work.


What started as his curiosity for pottery and vessel has extended to include painting and sculpture, and his present work is evidence of that evolution. He believes that color interaction can elicit new ways of seeing. He elects to stage conflict by introducing an assertive color field to an equally emphatic form. This friction augments and enriches perceptions of space. He believes in grounding his work within a historic study of this craft and within art as formal and cultural languages.

Born in Rochester, NY, Peter Pincus is a ceramic artist and instructor. He received his BFA (2005) and MFA (2011) in ceramics from Alfred University, He joined the School for American Crafts as Visiting Assistant Professor in Ceramics in Fall 2014.
